The liabilities to shareholders amounted to \$2,836,364, against \$1,545,100 in previous year. The total assets of the bank are \$1,097,717,470, against \$1,798,821 the previous year. The latter change is made up of a decrease of nearly \$7,000,000 in non-interest bearing deposits, and increase of nearly \$7,000,000 in savings deposits. Total assets show at \$1,097,717,470, against \$1,798,821, or 24.9, a decline of \$7,000,000, or 3.9 per cent. Current loans and discounts total \$1,091,183,392, against \$1,114,986,913. 28311-5-27

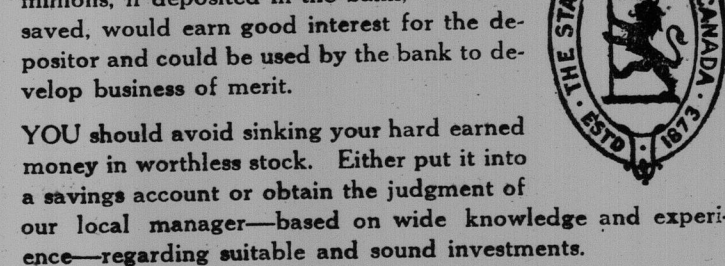

MEDALS TO X-RAY MARTYRS

French Commission Endowed by Car- negie Foundation Honors Three.
Paris, May 26. — The French com- mission endowed by the Carnegie Founda- tion and headed by former Premier Loubet, has awarded three gold medals to Mr. Charles Infrat, whose fingers were amputated after X-ray burnings; Dr. Adolphe Leroy, who was badly burned, and Dr. Vaillant, head of the Salpêtrière radiograph laboratory, who also received \$50,000 francs.
Dr. Infrat and Dr. Leroy both died recently as a result of their X-ray re- search work. Dr. Vaillant suffered ten amputations in ten years, losing fingers, then a hand, and finally his left arm. He still is experimenting, however.
