The telephone and the parcel post are doing wonders for E. S. Wann, general merchant in Pequot, Minn, a town with a population of only about 260, but the centre of a rigch agricultural district. Farms are so scattered that shopping in Pequot means a long trip for most of the farmers. Thus Wann hit upon the idea of utilizing telephone and parcel post.

"Many times it is difficult to hear over these phones," says Wann, "so when I receive an order I immediately repeat it to the customer. Even then there may be mistakes, so with every package I send a note saying that I hope the order has been filled correctly. If not I ask the customer to telephone me at once, so that I may make the necessary corrections. This shows them I am anxious to please them, and it not only holds rections.
