#### Human Flag Also Part of Royal Air Force Cadets' Welcome to King

The king went to a South Coast town recently to see the Royal Air Force brigade in training. Prince Albert, who is captain in command of one of the squadrons, took part in a march past. At the railway station a guard of honor was posted, consisting of men of 16 feet and over, from all parts of the empire.

On the sunny slope of a hill in rear of the parade ground was a huge khaki flag with the letters "R. A. F." formed by cadets. At a given signal they discarded their greatcoats, disclosing the red, yellow and light blue which make up the R. A. F. colors. Simultaneously they commenced singing the national anthem. As a further signal the human flag, and monogram retired over the hill, the cadets keeping perfect formation.

Many thousands of civilian sightseers lined up to see the king, who was given a rousing welcome.


