PREPARING PLANS FOR NEW RESERVOIR FOR LANCASTER HEIGHTS

Site Near Martello Tower-The "Go Devil" Here For Clearing The Old Mains

Plans are now being prepared for the new reservoir system which Commis sioner Wigmore will recommend for the supplying of water to the higher levels of Lancaster heights. His idea is the construction of a large circular concrete reservoir with a capacity of about 200,-000 gallons which would be filled from the Spruce Lake supply by the use of a six-inch centrifugal pump, and from which the water would be distributed to the higher levels. Under this system every place in the vicinity would be able to secure water on every flat, and a pressure of from thirty-six to forty pounds could be maintained at the fire hydrants even on the highest level.
