NEW BRIDGE NOT READY BEFORE NEXT JULY

Hon. John E. Wilson, Commissioner Wigmore, Commissioner Potts, Road Engineer Hatfield and A. R. Springer, government engineer, this week made an inspection of the approaches to the new highway bridge at the reversing falls. The visit was chiefly to approve of the Strait Shore road and the arrangements for the water main which is to be carried across the bridge.
