THE WIDOWS OF TIPPERARY

(Mail and Empire)

It may be a "long, long way to Tipperary," but it is also a "sad, sad day in Tipperary." That famous Irish town has 500 new widows—bereft wives of men in Irish regiments at the front. It is fortunate that most of us are spared experience of the grim agonies of the battlefield, that only in imagination can we depict the tragedies there. Were we handied by familiarity with bloodshed and carnage we should have only blunted and dulled sense of the pitiable sufferings of broken hearts far away from the front. The grim tragedies of war are not all on the battlefield. There are dozens of Tipperaries between the Rhine and the Vistula, "Mad Ambulances," of which Burris speaks, is laid upon them with crushing grasp. The Nixes and those about him, Bernhard and others of the league of nation-beggars have only the justifications.
