Calgary, Alta, Sept. 18—That the oppulation of Calgary is now close to 10,000 is the estimate of a directory of this city. The growth of the city is perhaps no better indicated than in the nerease of the school population. For the first two days of the school session which opened the first of the month the nrollment in Protestant public schools of Calgary was 6,748. The number regisering at the opening of last year was 960. At the close of the school year ast June the enrollment was 5,975.
