CONSERVATIVES WIN THE P. E. ISLAND ELECTIONS

Returns Last Night Indicated Only
Two or Three Liberals Elected

Charlottetown, P. E. I., Jan. 3.—The
elections today resulted in almost a clean
sweep for the Conservatives. With the
new house most Premier Matheson will
have twenty-six if not twenty-seven sup-
porters, whilst the opposition will be re-
presented by two or three members only.
The landslide was due mainly to three
causes. Long term of Liberals in office,
nearly twenty-one years, the defeat of the
Liberal federal government, and the prom-
ise by Premier Borden on the eve of
election to build a car ferry across the
Northumberland Strait.

PROGRESS OF FREDERICTON

(Fredericton Mail)
While the city of Fredericton has not
increased in population during the last
decade to any great extent, it has certainly
made considerable progress along other
lines. It has set the pace for Montreal,
Toronto and other great cities by instal-
ling a modern system of water filtration.
The plant is full of the equal of anything of
kind elsewhere in the world. It has set the
example of a modern city in Canada as
free from contagious diseases.

During the last decade Fredericton has
another forward step by installing an up-
to-date sewerage system. It looked like a
big battle for a small community to under-
take, and while the scheme encountered
some opposition, there are very few citi-
zens who would not now go back to the
old order of things. It is to be earned
early laid that in the near future it will
be found necessary to extend both the
water and sewerage systems.

Fredericton has also made a great start
with the work of permanent street paving.
Quebec street and part of York and
Carlton streets have been put in first-
class shape and no doubt during the next
few years the work will be extended to all
streets on which there is a heavy traffic.
The railway development shortly to be
started upon this vicinity means much
for Fredericton and undoubtedly the city
is on the eve of its real estate boom.
