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#### A NEW GOVERNOR.

Hon. William Pugsley has tendered his resignation as Lieutenant Governor and will retire from office at the end of the present month. He will resume the practice of law in this city. Whether he will return to public life rests, he says, with the people. Mr. W. F. Todd of St. Stephen has been appointed Lieutenant Governor. His appointment was anticipated, as his long and notable service to the Liberal party and his eminent fitness for the office of Governor were fully recognized.

The Province has never had a more popular Lieutenant Governor than Hon. William Pugsley, one more eager to meet the public and social requirements of the office. He and Mrs. Pugsley have always been quick to respond and gracious to aid in promoting every worthy cause. On every appropriate occasion His Honor has publicly endeavored to arouse the sense of pride in the province and faith in its future, and on one or two memorable occasions he very pointedly directed the attention of the rest of Canada to the unrecognized claims of the Maritime Provinces. He has been a most excellent Lieutenant Governor, and the popular favor he has won is fully shared by Mrs. Pugsley. Of Hon. Dr. Pugsley's past service to his native province and the Dominion the public records tell, and there will naturally be much speculation regarding his work and what he has still the capacity for work and in a public and representative capacity would wield a great influence for the good of this city and province.

The new Lieutenant Governor has sat in both Legislature and Parliament, and if not always successful in political campaigns in Charlotte County he has never lost the respect and esteem of his people. He is regarded by all parties as a high-minded and honorable citizen, and nowhere will his appointment be so universally welcomed as in the county where he has fought so many hard political battles. St. John people will most cordially welcome him, as they did another Charlotte County Governor, the late Hon. G. W. Gannon, who unhappily did not live to complete his term of office.

The next session of the Provincial Legislature will open with a new Lieutenant Governor as well as a new Premier, and several new members of the House, elected since the session of last year. All this will lend additional interest to the session.

#### AN IMPORTANT MEETING.

The meeting to be held on Monday afternoon in the Board of Trade to discuss the possibilities of export trade must appeal very strongly to business men. The Maritime Provinces must develop export trade. The necessity grows more and more apparent. Our seaboard position and our varied natural resources place us in a very favorable position. We have found by experience that because of distance and high freight rates we cannot compete on equal terms in the markets of western Canada, and we must therefore take advantage of our seaboard position. What can we export? Which and how many of our natural resources may be made the basis of an export business? How can it best be reached? What markets can most easily be reached, and with what classes of goods? These questions will be discussed on Monday. Mr. Egan, the Canadian Trade Commissioner for South Africa, is to come here for Monday's meeting, to discuss the possibilities of export trade to that country.

The subject of export trade has been much considered in a general way as the need of it has grown more obvious. It concerns not merely the manufacturers but all business men. Therefore Monday's meeting should be most fruitful in arousing a still more general interest, leading up to a definite drive to develop export trade.

A correspondent complains that enough credit is not given to Charles Gorman for making possible the bringing of the skating championships to St. John last year and this year, by his brilliant work three years ago. Mr. Gorman certainly deserves the highest credit, and the Times believes the citizens at large appreciate his fine record. The reception given him at Lily Lake during the present meet, although he did not win the honors, showed how warm a place he has in the hearts of sport-lovers in St. John.

The City Council or some of its members appear to be determined to waste thousands of dollars of the city's money by holding up the Monday meeting. Power Commission. The people want cheap light and power. The Council is standing in the way.

The last day of the Winter Carnival brings bright sunshine and a crisp air. It is a day to be enjoyed. The Carnival has been a wonderful success. It will doubtless be made an annual feature in the life of the city.

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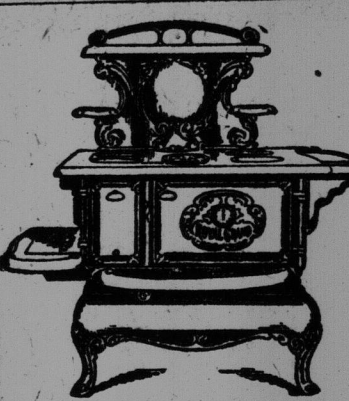

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### MOTORS And Their Care



When Brake Bands Squeak  
When it becomes firmly interlocked in the brake lining, causing a squeal, use a treatment of a little rosin mixed with castor oil applied to the bands.

**Importance of Rear Light.**  
A motorist should inspect the tail-light of his car frequently. This light marks the position of his car for the driver coming in the rear, who may be facing lights of an oncoming machine.

**Proper Adjustments.**  
Always keep the foot pedal and hand lever in proper position, so that the foot pedal will never go down far enough to strike the floor board, and so that the hand lever will never pull back and strike in its slot.

**Dangers of Gasoline Vapor.**  
To prevent vapor of gasoline from spreading, care must be taken to avoid overflow. Any gasoline spilled over the tank or around the car forms a dangerous vapor which may be ignited as soon as the engine is started.

**Economize on "Gas."**  
The gasoline bill can be reduced by never allowing the engine to run idle. A great deal more gasoline is used in this way than is suspected. Shut off the engine every time there is an occasion to stop the car for any length of time.

**Rain Water Best for Radiator.**  
Pure rain water is the best that can be used in the cooling system. This is because it is free from mineral substances, which are present in ordinary water, and which are deposited on the metal walls of the radiator, piping, jackets, etc., to their detriment. Therefore, when rain water is available, always use it.

**Care of Spare Tires.**  
The spare tire is one of the spare tire is one part of a car that is often overlooked, but should be attended to regularly. This may be done by cleaning it with mud and road oil, or the spare stands in a pool of water. A great deal more gasoline is used in this way than is suspected. **About Chains.**  
Never attach them to a spoke. Never fasten chains so tight that they cannot creep. Do not repair a tire with wire. It will ruin the tire. Drape the chain over the tire with the chains toward the rear of the car. The chains should be placed so that the hooks of the cross links are outside.

**For the Leather Cone Clutch.**  
When a leather-covered cone clutch sticks badly and becomes hard to release, pour gasoline over it repeatedly, letting it in and out, using every possible means to clean it thoroughly. Then let it dry for several hours and apply neatfoot oil on the leather. Block it out over night so that the pressure from the spring will not squeeze out the oil.

**Cold Weather Protection.**  
A car that is to be operated throughout the winter should have a non-freezing solution in the radiator. Some sort of cover should be provided for the radiator, so that the engine can be maintained at the proper temperature. The working parts require light oil frequently. Slick chains are essential for driving on icy roads, and the brakes should be kept in perfect working order.

**Never travel at a high rate of speed over a road which is unfamiliar.**

**FAT MAN BREAKS LEG**  
REDUCING HIS WEIGHT  
Rope Snaps as He "Chins the Bar" and Victim May Be Cripple for Life.

New York, Feb. 17.—"Chinning the bar" as a weight-reducing exercise, using a rope stretched between two steam pipes in his office as the "bar," resulted in Gustave Schmeider, 50 years old, being taken to New York Hospital with injuries which doctors say may cripple him for life. Schmeider has a broken left leg and a possible fracture of the right ankle, received when the rope he was "chinning" broke, and he fell to the floor.

He is short and weighs 195 pounds. After his fall he lay in agony for awhile and then dragged himself to a telephone and called police headquarters, telling what had happened.

The West Thirtieth street station was notified and Patrolman James McKelrick and an ambulance with Dr. Thompson of New York Hospital were sent to the office building. After he was attended, Patrolman McKelrick carried the man downstairs on his back from the fifth floor to the ambulance, as the elevator was not running.
