THE VICTORIA DISASTER.

The collision of the Camperdown and Victoria off Tripoli last week is the most terrible naval disaster in point of number of lives lost that has occurred in a time of peace since the foundering of the

Royal George off Spithead. Fifteen minutes after the Camperdown's ram entered her side the Victoria keeled over and plunged to the bottom in 60 fathoms of water, carrying down with her, Vice Admiral Sir George Tyron and 463 officers and men. In England the receipt of this terrible news caused universal sorrow and suspended all social events.
