A I was 12.  
Q-27. You were 12 years old?  
A Yes.  
Q-28. And then what did you do?  
A Went to work.  
Q-29. What was the nature of your work?  
A Loading ties.  
Q-30. What kind of ties?  
A Railroad and mining.  
Q-31. Then you joined the army in October, where did you join the army?  
A Sudbury.  
Q-32. From there where did you go?  
A To Toronto.
