The Petit Séminaire de Ste-Marie de Monnoir was founded in the year 1853, by the late Very Rev. Edward Crevier, Vicar General, with a view to preparing young men, not only for the Church and the high callings of civil life, but also for commercial industries. Hence the course of studies, in which religious instruction keeps the first rank, is divided into two sections: the commercial course and the classical course.

The COMMERCIAL COURSE comprises three years. It includes the study of the French and English Languages, Mathematics, Book-Keeping, History. Epistolary Correspondence, in a word, everything required for a commercial education.

The CLASSICAL COURSE follows the commercial course. Il embraces Greek, Latin, History, Mathematics, Belles-Lettres, Rhetoric, Elocution, Astronomy, Chemistry, Physics, Intellectual and Moral Philosophy, and all that prepares for the liberal professions.

The Institution is directed by secular priests. The faculty is composed of priests and seminarians.
