HINTS FOR THE FARMER.

SOME DAIRY RULES. The following rules concerning the production and handling of milk have been derived from the annual report of the United States Bureau of Animal Industry.

- 1. Read current dairy literature and keep posted on new ideas. 2. Observe and enforce the utmost cleanliness about the cattle, their attendants, the stable, the dairy and all utensils. 3. A person suffering from any disease or who has been exposed to a contagious disease must remain away from the cows and the milk. THE STABLE. 4. Keep dairy cattle in a room or building by themselves. It is preferable to have no cellar below and no storage room for manure.
