B., March 30.—Premier Hazen to-night issued the following statement regarding the bye election in York County today and its result and effect: "The result of the bye-election in York County, it seems unnecessary for me to say, is intensely gratifying to me. I have taken very little part in the campaign, my time being fully occupied with the work of the Leg-islature. But the members of the Government, and the Legislature entered into the fight so willingly and proved so well informed on public questions, and such superior debators, that it made little difference. "While the St. John Valley, Railway was discussed very largely during the campaign it was not the main issue although the people along the river felt that the ad-ministration were the only ones that had taken any practical steps towards the building of that desirable public work.
