TWO AND A HALF MILLION CHINESE IN NEED OF HELP

Severe Famine and Failure of Crops Responsible for Unhappy Condition of People—Plea for Help.

To the Citizens of St. John: Urgent letters have been received this Friday—February 9th—morning from the Central China Famine Relief Committee in Shanghai appealing for immediate help. The letters are authentic and contain a statement of the situation. Briefly summarized the account is as follows:

1. Two and a half million people in dire need of help. Appeals have been received from three main districts aggregating 30,000 square miles—the Hwai River district, the Wuhu district and the Hankow district. Population, seven millions.
2. Causes conspiring to promote the present situation: Severe famine last year, scant crops for five years past, work animals eaten last year, business at a standstill, schools closed, the weak becoming beggars, the strong becoming robbers, sale of wives and daughters, often into lives of vice, the failure of the Manchou government to keep the rivers dredged and embankments repaired.
3. Benevolent Chinese who have given liberally in the past now find themselves ruined. The country is a mere mass of a revolution—due in large measure to such conditions as these—which is absorbing the attention and resources of the people to the exclusion of all else.
4. The policy of the Central China Relief Committee: To give relief without pauperizing in return for labor, except in the case of those unable to work. To make this labor count in preventing future floods. To induce the Chinese government and local gentry, as far as possible, to give immediate relief and to undertake their own reclamation work.
5. To make the alleviation of suffering in connection with this famine the occasion of a great expression of international goodwill to the New China. The Chius of yesterday feared and hated the foreigner, and not without reason. The New China will respond to friendship.

The Appeal.
Three dollars will support a family for one month. It is estimated that \$5,000,000 is necessary to meet the present situation. Of this a large part will be raised in China. Canada and the United States are asked to raise \$1,000,000. It is imperative that money begin to come at once in order that great loss of life may be averted.
Convinced of the necessity for immediate action the Executive Committee of the Evangelical Alliance of St. John today promptly authorized the re-constitution of the committee in charge of the local China Relief Fund of a short time ago with Joshua Clawson, Esq., as treasurer. This committee will take action without delay and it is fully expected that the citizens of this city which is renowned for its philanthropy, will once again respond to China's need with splendid generosity.
The pastors of all the churches are respectfully but urgently requested to bring this appeal before their congregations next Sabbath at all the services and to plead for an immediate response. It is also suggested that the pastors should act as treasurers of the fund and receive the contributions and receive whatever contributions their people may see fit to make.
Please send your contributions at once. It will save life.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that a Bill will be presented for enactment at the next Session of the Provincial Legislature to further amend the "St. John Assessment Act, 1909," and amending Acts.

The objects desired to be attained by this Act are:
(1) To provide that after the 1st day of January, 1912, the tax on buildings and improvements be reduced fifty per centum and after such date still further reduced from time to time until the tax on such buildings and improvements disappears altogether; also that the land exclusive of buildings shall be assessed at twice the true value, to provide for the revenue lost on account of the decrease in the taxation of such buildings and improvements.
(2) To provide that personal property be exempt from taxation as soon as circumstances will permit.
(3) To empower the Common Council of the City of Saint John to appoint a Commission which shall become a permanent Court with power to adjust as equitably as possible all difficulties which may arise on account of the Change above mentioned, more particularly with reference to long renewal leases.
(4) To provide that the Five dollar poll tax be reduced to Two dollars.
(5) To repeal Section 1 of the Act of Assembly 10 Ed. 7, Cap. 64 (1910), which provides that the rate of taxation for the years 1911, 1912, 1913, 1914, 1915 and 1916 shall not exceed the tax rate for the year 1910.
