

SIX MONTHS' HONEYMOON IN JAIL
JUST ENDED BY MOUNTAIN COUPLE

MR. AND MRS. HARLEY BAILLES.

Harley Bailles, twenty-two years old, and his bride of seventeen have just ended a six months' honeymoon in jail at Atlanta, Ga.

Moved by public sentiment as well as by a spirit of justice, Judge W. T. Newman, of the United States District Court, issued an order releasing the couple from Fulton County Jail. They had been confined there six months for no other reason than that they were witnesses in a murder case in which the alleged slayers have not yet been captured, and possibly never will be.

It was the announced intention of the government officials to keep Mr. Bailles and his wife in jail until the murderers were caught. And so the mountain innocents, to whom love of liberty is greater perhaps than to the average dweller in a city flat, spent their honeymoon in a cell in a murderous row.

GULF LINE SHOW PROFIT.

The directors of the Gulf Line, Ltd. (Punnett, Withy and Co.) London, in their fourteenth annual report, show a net profit of £75,109 15s. 7d., to which is added a credit balance from last account of £179 18s. 6d., making £75,289 14s. 1d.; £74,800 had been written off against depreciation and loss on realized assets, the latter item now being entirely disposed of. There is a balance to carry forward to next account of £1,339 10s. 6d. The company is of the opinion that the company will in future be in a position to pay regular dividends.

HARBORFRONT NOTES.

The South African Line steamer Ninian, Capt. Williams, sailed yesterday for Cape Town and other South African ports with a large general cargo.

The Allan Line steamer Pomorania for London and Havre took away Canadian goods valued at \$11,635, making a total of \$125,998.

The Head Line steamer Ramore Head, for Belfast, took away Canadian goods valued at \$166,669. Her grain shipments are 103,932 bushels of wheat, 2100 bushels of oats, and 728 bushels of corn.

The Donaldson Line steamer Saturnia for Glasgow, took away Canadian goods valued at \$100,248 and foreign goods valued at \$181,001, making a total valuation of \$1,812,255. Her wheat shipments are 50,457 bushels.

The C. P. R. steamer Monmouth, Capt. Murray, for Liverpool for St. John was 110 miles east of Cape Sable at 6:40 a.m. Tuesday. She will reach St. John this evening.

STEAMER BADLY STRAINED.

London, Mar. 11.—Str. Harmatris, from Norfolk via Port Natal for Manila (previously reported having returned to Port Natal damaged by heavy weather), is seriously strained from stem to stern and is leaking; must discharge all cargo in No. 1 hold and go into dry dock for survey and repairs.

Mobile, Ala., Mar. 11.—Tug Echo reported the capture of a large schooner for Morgan City ashore 10 miles E. of Ship Shoal, La.; a heavy sea is running.

Captain Martin Forrest formerly of the Pickford and Black steamer Rhodan, is now in command of the new steamer Kenross, belonging to R. J. Sutherland and Co., of Newcastle, England. The Kenross is a boat of 5,000 net.
