BRANTFORD PROFITS BY ELECTRIC LINES.

During the past nine months the Brantford municipalities have increased earnings to such an extent as to collect a surplus of \$9,494 after payment of interest and sinking fund and allowing depreciation for payment. The tickets sales for the Grand Valley, Brantford to Paris increased from \$10,466 to \$13,803, while for the street railway lines they increased from \$62,102 to \$77,338. The total increased earnings from both lines were \$21,584.

TWO FATALITIES IN BRANTFORD
Two fatalities among workmen occurred in Brantford on Saturday one due to a factory accident and the other victim being a railway section man.

Walter England received fatal injuries when, as he turned away from an empty wheel, the wheel broke and the pieces struck him in the head and back. He died about 11 o'clock Saturday night in Brantford hospital.


George Harry Kut, an Armenian section hand on the Lake Erie &

Northern Railway was struck yesterday afternoon near Mount Pleasant by a freight engine and died of his injuries a few hours later. One leg was severed and the skull fractured. Kut, while at work failed to notice the approaching engine. An inquest has been ordered.

LEFT A BIG ESTATE.
George W. Robinson, one of London's most prominent citizens, who's death occurred several months ago, left an estate valued at \$968,882.820 according to his will, which has been entered for probate in the surrogate court.

DEATH OF PROMINENT LONDON LAWYER.
R. M. C. Toth, one of London's best known lawyers, died suddenly at the home of his sister, Mrs. S. K. Davidson, London on Saturday morning at 11 o'clock in his 61st year.
