CARIGNAN, ONÉSIME. (*Champlain.*)

S. of Pierre Carignan and Josephite Turcotte of the parish of Champlain. B. there 16 Oct. 1839, and ed. at the parish school. M. 15 Nov. 1864, Demoiselle Aglaée Le Bel. Is a wholesale and retail grocer. Was an alderman of the City of Three Rivers from 1876 to 1888 and pro-Maire for a long time; founder and Presdt. for several years of the Benevolent Soc. of L'Union St. Joseph. First returned to Parlt. at last g. e. A Conservative.—*Three Rivers, P. Q.*

CARPENTER, Major FRANKLIN METCALFE. (*South Wentworth.*)

Grandfather, a native of Eng., first emigrated to the United States; came to Can. with the U.E. Loyalists and settled in the Tp. of Saltfleet, Ont. B. there 31 Jan., 1843, and ed. at the Public Sch. M., 24 Nov., 1880, Catherine H., dau. of John Gairdiner, of Orono. Is a farmer. Has been a Municipal Councillor, Reeve of Saltfleet for ten years in succession, and Warden of the Co. of Wentworth. Entered 77th Wentworth Batt. V.M. as Capt., May, 1872, and was promoted to be Major 17th March, 1882. Was elected for South Wentworth at g.e., June, 1879, but was unseated on petition. First returned to Parlt. at g.e., 1887, and re-elected at last g.e. A Conservative.—*Stoney Creek, P.O.*

CARON, Hon. Sir JOSEPH PHILIPPE RÉNÉ ADOLPHE, K.C. M.G., Q.C., P.C. (*Rimouski.*)

Eld. surviving s. of the late Hon. R. E. Caron, Lieut.-Governor of the Prov. of Quebec. Born in the City of Quebec, 1843. Ed. at the Seminary of Quebec, at Laval Univ. and at McGill Univ., at which last institution he graduated B.C.L., 1865. M., 25 June, 1867, Alice, only dau. of the late Hon. François Baby, who represented Stadacona division in L. C. of Can. for several years. Studied law with L. C. Baillargé, Esq., Q.C., and subsequently with the late Hon. Sir John Rose, Bart., and was called to the Bar, L. C., 1865. Apptd. a Q.C. 19 May, 1879. Was a dir. of the Stadacona Bank, and in 1867 was Vice-Presdt. of the Literary and Historical Soc. of Quebec. Sworn of the Privy Council and apptd.
