

cluding the Alexandra Suspension Bridge over the Fraser River, built by him on terms of toll Charter. Was Chief Commr. of Lands and Works and Surveyor-Genl. of B.C., in succession to Genl. R. C. Moody, R.E., and a mem. *ex officio* of the Ex. and Legislative Councils, from 1864 until the Union of the Colony with Can., 1871. Was intimately connected with the conduct of the negotiations for the Union of B.C. with Can., having been a delegate to Ottawa with Hon. Messrs. Helmcken and Carrall, in 1870, to confer with the Can. Govt. as to the terms of Union, and again, in 1871, to Ottawa and London, to settle finally the details of the arrangements for Union. Apptd. first Lieut.-Governor of B.C. under Confederation, 5 July, 1871. (Salary \$7,000.) *Government House, Victoria. B.C.*
