How penalties shall be levied.

11. The penalties hereby inflicted shall, upon proof of the offence, respectively, before any one or more Justices of the Peace for the said District of Quebec, either by the confession of the offender, or by the oath of one or more credible witness or witnesses (which oath such Justice is hereby empowered and required to administer), be levied by 5 distress and sale of the goods and chattels of such offender, by warrant signed by such Justice or Justices of the I'cace, and the overplus, after such penalties and the charge of such distress and sale are deducted, shall be returned, on demand, to the owner of such goods and chattels, and one half of such penaltics, respectively, when paid and levied, shall 10 belong to Her Majesty, and the other half to the person suing for the same.

lleight of arches above high water. 12. Provided always that the said bridge that is to be built on the River Etchemin shall have under its arches an elevation of at least seven feet above high water, and a distance of at least seventy-five feet 15 between the several piers thereof.

13. This Act shall be deemed a Public Act.
