## Sheridan takes over first as Centennial swamped 14-0

At Oakville Arena, Thursday night, the Sheridan Bruins moved into first place in the O.C.A.A. Southern Conference, for the first time this season, with a convincing 14-0 white-wash of last-place Centennial Colts.

With league play now suspended for the Christmas break, the Bruins' 12-1 winless record gives them 24 points, one more than the Humber Hawks who have 11 wins, two losses and a tie going into the New Year.

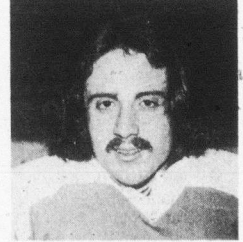
Despite the lopsided score, Bruins' goaltender Bill Allen of Mississauga was full value for the shut-out, the first by any Southern Conference team this season.

Allen stopped all 26 Centennial shots, including many from in close. At the other end of the rink, Matt Nutson was tested 42 times as the Oakville squad was allowed to free-wheel inside the Colts blue line.

The game produced a rarity in the penalty department as the Bruins' John Burrows served the only penalty of the game, a two-minute elbowing minor assessed early in the first period.

Holding period leads of 5-0 and 9-0, eight Bruins shared in the goal-scoring, with the Duncan-Grant-Redshaw line accounting for eight goals.

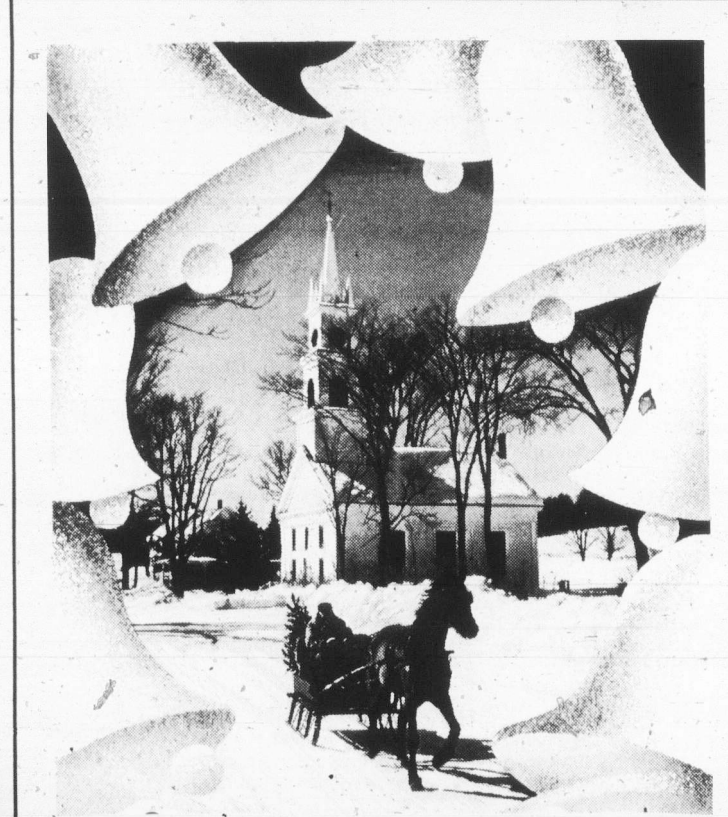
