On account of the Ensign hoisting parade, flying did not commence until 0900 hours and continued throughout the day on schedule. The day was bright and sunny and very warm. The Station was visited at 1530 hours by the Inspector General, Air Vice Marshall Croil who made an unofficial tour of the Station and appeared pleased with its condition. Air Commodore Cuffe arrived on the Station at 1830 hours and remained until 2000 hours, making a tour of the Station with the C.O.	
	23-5-41		The weather today was overcast and threatening rain; during the afternoon there were a few sprinkles but not enough to interfere with the flying which was carried on during the day except during the wings presentation. Wings Parade for Course 23 was held at 1400 hours and wings presented to 49 R.A.A.F. Aircrew and 9 R.C.A.F. Aircrew. Presentation was made by Sir Clive Bailleau to the R.A.A.F. and by the Hon. C.D. Howe, Minister of Munitions & Supply, to the R.C.A.F. Aircrew. The C.O. and Sir Clive both gave introductory remarks of congratulations and encouragement to the Aircrew before the presentation and after the ceremony they marched past in a following order, Wings Party, No. 1 Squadron, No. 2 Squadron and the R.C.A.F. Central Band, the salute being taken by Sir Clive Bailleau. Later tea was served in the Officers' Mess and many of those attending the
