On the motion of Mrs. F.L.Shaffner, seconded by Mrs. John Stanfield, the chair was taken by Mrs. Stewart McClenaghan. Miss Low was asked to act as secretary, and called upon to outline her plan for the formation of a gederal association of Conservative Women. A letter was read from Mrs. Robert Rogers, wife of the member for Winnipe South, offering valuable suggestions and promising active help. A tentative plan for organization was freely discussed. It was decided to call an organization meeting for Monday, June I4, at the house of Mrs. Stewart McClenaghan, 330 Cooper Street.

The meeting then adjourned.
