In Ontario 4512 Indians received annuity under the Robinson Treaties of 1850 @ \$4.00 per head.

Negotiations were entered into during the past summer with Indians of Ontario not included in the Robinson Treaty whose hunting grounds are bounded on the East and North by the boundaries of Ontario, on the South by the Height of Land and the Northern boundary of the Robinson Treaty, on the West by part of the territory ceded by Treaty 3, - the whole comprising about 90,000 square miles.

The number brought under this Treaty last year was about 2,500, who will in future be paid an annuity of \$4.00 per capita. This number does not include all the Indians within the territory mentioned as a number of the Bands could not be visited during the past season. It is the intention to complete the Treaty next year, when it is expected that the information regarding the number of Indians covered by the district included within the Treaty will be obtained.

Many of the Indian Bands have also amounts to their credit derived from the sale or rent of their lands or received for timber dues, etc. Statements of these accounts will be found in the Auditor General's Report Part " J," a copy of which is being forwarded to you.

The expenditure in connection with Indian Schools amounted during the year ended 30th June, 1904, to \$394,965.71, divided as follows : -
