
Sir,-

In reply to your letter of the 25th of August regarding the well for the Little Pine School, I beg to say that it is considered advisable to continue the purchase of water until Mr. Inspector Chisholm is on the reserve, when he, along with yourself should thoroughly inspect the surroundings and advise the Department if the present well is favourably located for procuring water or if a more likely position might be chosen.

If the Inspector considers the present location as favourable as any, then the well might be continued to 200 feet, and if the site is unfavourable and a more suitable position located, a new well should be bored in an effort to procure water.

Mr. Inspector Chisholm is being advised accordingly.
