



Ottawa, April 7th., 1919.

Sir,-

Referring to your letter of the 2nd September last, submitting the application for admission to Treaty of William Dick and family, Indians of York Factory Band who were absent at Trout Lake when the adhesion to Treaty No. 5 was taken at York Factory in 1910, but who have now returned to the latter place and intend to remain there, I beg to state that as it is shown that the people named in your letter were entitled to be taken into Treaty had they been present at the adhesion, you are authorized to place their names on the pay-list of the York Factory Band at the next distribution and pay them annuities in the future, but they are not entitled to arrears and you should inform them accordingly. Please quote the date and number of this letter opposite their names in the next annuity pay-list, as authority for their admission to Treaty.
