McIntyre, W of the 244 Coy., Pioneer Corps having been duly sworn, states -On the night of the 19th of August, 1943, at about 2345 hrs. · I was standing outside the doors of Sandhurst Block, Bulford Mil. Camp, with Pte. Etephens, A.T.S., when I happ--ened to glance up the road and noticed five Canadian soldiers approaching from the direction of the C.R.S. Question -Is the figure "five" a definite one? Answer - I am not certain of the exact number. I paid no more attention until I was pushad. I then Continue please. turned to ask why I was pushed and the next thing I knew, I was on the ground. Question - How did you reach the ground? Answer - I was struck a blow and then pulled down. Then I was beaten up. One took hold of my left foot, and twisting it, broke the shoe. The next thing I remembered, I was walking away with Pte. S tephens. <u>Question</u> - Have you any idea how long it was after the start of the assault before you remembered walking away? About eight minutes. Answer -The next thing that I remembered was someone grabbing my arm Continue please. I remembered nothing that followed until two Canadian soldiers approachedme, also from the direction of the C.R.C. (Camp Reception Center). One assisted me while the other helped Pte. Stephens who was crying and hysterical. I then decided to report the matter to the 1st Cdn Para Bm. <u>Question</u> - What direction is, "from the direction of C.R.C." Answer - I mean, from the top of camp towards the bottom. The accused, B73846 Fte. LEE, M.N., declines to cross-examine this
