# COXIN MANY CONCERNS ABSOLUTE

Senator Outlines the Field of His Investments.

Admits That Hyde's Fate Is Before His Eyes In Preventing One-Man Control -Built Up the Imperial Life For His Son to Manage Instead of Securing Him a Position With the Canada Life-Stock Investment.

Toronto, June 2.—Senator Cox was again on the stand all day yesterday before the Insurance Commission, except for a short time at the beginning when Co. Macdonald of Confederation Life corrected some incorrect impressions from his evidence about New Zealand insurance.

Cox Could Wait. Senator Cox, president of the Canada Life, succeeded Col. Macdonald on the stand, having waited from the opening

of the court. "It's very desirable to know in advance who's going to vote," was his candid confession when asked about the twenty days' notice required from policyholders for their proxies.

The amount of interest policyholders

took in the proxy business varied considerably, according to the Senator. In 1900, out of 6,500 policyholders 1,905 proxies were sent in. This was the first year proxies were in force. In 1902, 7,330 policyholders only contributed 266 proxies. In 1908, 8,800 policyholders 7,330 policyholders only contributed 200 proxies. In 1906, 8,800 policyholders sent in 768 proxies. This increase in the number was due to the increased interest in life insurance, following the United States investigation.
