## Legal Decisions

A man who takes a paper regularly from the Post Office, whether directed to his name or another's or whether he has authorized or not to be responsible for the payment.

If a person takes a paper from the office in an irregular manner and the publisher or his agent does not know of it until the paper is paid for, and the publisher, whether the paper is taken from the office or not.

The courts have decided in favor of the publisher in all such cases, and in the case of a person who has authorized another to take a paper from the office, the courts have also decided in favor of the publisher.
