Some Old Table-Talkers.

Temperance principles have permeated through every branch of literature, through all society. Even in the popular novels of the day one finds bits like this from Madame Sarah Grand's "Heavenly Twins": "Evadne used her glass only to put her gloves in."

Many, I had almost said most, women who are leaders of society in their own cities, do not know the taste of wine though perhaps allowing it to be served at their own tables, and though the work of the Women's Christian Temperance Union be an unknown quantity to them.

One of the greatest generals and noblest of the world's heroes, General Robert E. Lee, passed through four years of unparalleled hardship, in march and battle without ever tasting alcohol in any form. His conquering opponent, General Grant, left his glass unturned at every table where the richest of wines flowed freely.

Since prohibition is now an unusual thing let us look back into those old days when it was a thing almost unique, yet not without its advocates. Let us glance into those old days when there was leisure instead of hurry, letters instead of journalism, epigrams in Latin and Greek instead of imitations of Provençal verse, lumbering stage coaches instead of lightning-speed Pullmans, and above all, by way of difference, brilliant "table-talk," in place of platform oratory.

And, strangely at variance with the wine-lover's claim that the social glass is necessary to create and inspire glowing conversation and flashing sallies of wit, we find several of our prohibitionists among these same now world-known table-talkers.

The world that called itself "all the world" then had a short diameter, and one man's voice could reach from center to circumference of that world of art, letters, science, and that one man was Dr. Samuel Johnson. His world was one worth speaking in. Then, Sir Joshua Reynolds painted and Cervantes played and Sam Foote joked and Mrs. Pizarro peared tea; Pope penned his flying measures, Pitt and Burke roused their hearers with matches eloquence, and Goldsmith, little as Bowdler fancied him or his genius, wrote the greatest of English novels, The Vicar of Wakefield. Then wine flowed like water, and Dr. Johnson's "R a s h" has hardly brought him more fame than his too-kindling propensity.

The first note of the abstinence cause from since is in his early struggles in London when he had come up from Lichfield with Garick to try his fortunes with the rest of the geniuses of his time. "I din-din," he tells his own story, "very well for eight pence with very good company at the Pine Apple in New Street, just by. They expected to every day, but did not know one another's names. It used to cost the rest a shilling for the drink wine; but I had a cut of meat for six pence and bread for a penny, and gave the waiter a penny, so that I was quite well served, nay, better than the rest, for they gave the waiter nothing."

Though we find no absolute prohibitions against drink we find throughout his "Fragers and Meditations" evidence that his abstinence was the outcome of serious thought and intention, and as well for the health of his soul and mind as body. "By abstinence," he writes, "from wine and spirits, I obtained sudden and great relief, and had freedom of mind restored to me, which I have wanted for all this year."

Where Drink Put Him.

It is said that Charles Gardiner, once a partner of George M. Pullman, has been sent to a home for drunkards. The two were fellow apprentices at the cabinet maker's bench in New York State before the war. When Pullman went to Chicago, Gardiner went with him, and when Pullman started to his first employer, Gardiner was his assistant and confidant. Subsequently Gardiner was the foreman of Pullman's first shop, and many of the early patents are said to be the result of his genius. He was always infatuated with the Pullman works, had lived near them always, and late years has made it a habit to go into the shops, look at the men working, here a few times, and then go to the nearest saloon. George M. Pullman's temperance was for so his own person is concerned. His friend, his equal in most superior in business ability, must now remain in a drunkard's home.
