The fire broke out in the roof in the immediate vicinity of the Times office, and spread rapidly to the other offices.

All the employees were away to dinner at the time. The fire department quickly responded, but the fire had made considerable headway before being covered.

The building was badly damaged, the bindery totally destroyed and the job department more or less damaged.

The news room escaped damage, but the contents of the stock room and public office, as well as the editor's office, were badly damaged by water. The loss is estimated at between \$2,000 and \$3,000, covered by insurance.

Is a Total Wreck

BARQUE ARMOUDA DRIVEN ASHORE ON MICHOU ISLAND—CREW SAVED.

BARROUET, Oct. 22.—The Norwegian barque Armouda, 926 tons, Captain Haugen, from Liverpool for Campbellton, drove ashore near Michou Island about one o'clock on Sunday morning last during a stormy gale and blowing snow storm. Crew saved.

The vessel lying about two hundred yards from shore and is a total wreck. The crew, thirteen in all, arrived here last evening and were sent to St. John by the Norwegian consul, Mr. George Gilbert, this morning.

Some of the crew complain that on returning to the vessel on Monday evening after the storm had subsided they found everything had been on board and had plundered everything they could take away.

The captain has returned to the wreck.
