Toronto Live Stock.
Receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Yards were 40 car loads, composed of 927 cattle, 73 sheep and 16 calves.

The quality of fat cattle in a few instances was good, but the bulk could not be classified as finished. Trade was better than a week ago, although there was double the amount of stock on sale.

Prices were practically unchanged. Exporters—Prices ranged from \$4.25 to \$4.70. McDonald & Mayhew having sold one load, 1,440 pounds each, at the latter price. Export bulls sold at \$3.25 to \$3.75.

Butchers—The best load of butchers' cattle on the market were those brought in by Mr. Kinney, which were bought for the Levee Dressed Beef Co., at \$4.65; best loads sold from \$4.25 to \$4.65; medium, \$3.75 to \$4; common, \$3.25 to \$3.50; cows, 2.50 to \$3.50; calves, 75c to 1.50 per cwt.

Fedders and Stockers—Not many feeders and stockers were offered, although there was a good demand for them. Harry Murby and several farmers and live stock dealers being on the lookout for them. Prices were quoted unchanged by Mr. Murby, as follows:

Milkers and Springers—Milkers and springers were in good demand and sold from \$27 to \$32 each.

Veal Calves—Trade steady at unchanged quotations, at \$4 to \$6.50 per cwt.

Hogs—Gunn's, Limited, quoted hogs at \$5 per cwt, fed and watered, and \$4.75 L.O.B., cars, at company points.

George Taylor, buyer for H. P. Kennedy, reports the same prices as the Gunn's company.

Stocks and Bonds

Noon Stock Letter received by A. E. Carpenter from Ennis & Stoppani:

New York, Dec. 3.—The market during the morning was erratic and extremely active, with vigorous attempts to cover short contracts and replace long stocks, against which there appeared considerable profit taking, particularly at higher prices reached. The speculation that the Smelters' dividend will not be reduced practically, if at all, was a factor in this issue. The Pennsylvania has reported for ten months of the year ending December 3, and present indications are that combined surpluses of the eastern and western lines will be equivalent to 12.3 per cent. on the stock, as compared with 13.2 per cent. last year. Allowing for various sinking funds and for trust payments, the earnings last year were considerably below this percentage. Assuming that with additional payments of this character during the current year, the amount of nine million dollars should properly be deducted, we have actual earning power applicable to dividends of 9.6 per cent. Last year Canadian Pacific earned 11 per cent. on amount of stock which will be outstanding when the present \$28,320,000 proposed increase is made. The net earnings for four months, including October, are practically equal to those of last year, and with no special depreciation charges as called for by the Interstate Commerce Commission, and the chance for fairly normal winter weather, the outlook seems favorable. The figures above given take no account of land sales. President Ripley's explanation of Atchafalpa expense accounts, it appears that the common stock will have earnings of considerably over 9 per cent. for the year ending July 1, 1908. It is thought probable that the Anaconda and Amalgamated Copper dividends will be reduced further at the coming meeting. The market reflects cessation of the tremendous liquidation pressure in evidence for months past. A fair recession, it should be profitable to acquire stocks—Ennis & Stoppani.
