COL. STEELE, C.B., M.V.O.

The recent publication by Col. Steele of the military history of the prairie province, brings to mind the leading part the colonel himself played in its history, though he took too great care that he did not figure in the article, so that the reading of it was like "Hamlet" with the principal character left out.

Col. Samuel Benfield Steele was born in County Simcoe, in the year 1849 and educated at Orillia School and the British American Commercial School, Toronto. He was granted his first commission in 1886 in the Militia and on the return of the Red River Expedition in 1870 joined the Canadian Permanent Artillery. Mr. Steele joined the N. W. Mounted Police in 1873 rising to superintendence in 1885. For the next four years Col. Steele commanded the Police in most of their expeditions against the Indians and to restore order in the new districts. He was chosen to command the "Strathcona" Horse in the South African War. Col. Steele is now commanding military district No. 11.

As a sportsman Col. Steele is well known as one who takes a keen interest in every exercise that will strengthen a man bodily and mentally.

### THE KING'S THRONE.

Hard to Say Which is the Real Throne.

The King may be said to have a suite of thrones—or shall we say a set of "occasional thrones"—on each of which he probably sits at least once. Certainly he only sits on a single occasion upon one of them—that is the Coronation Chair in Westminster Abbey—the worn-out, battered, high-backed old oak settee which contains the Stone of Destiny, and upon which all the King's predecessors since Edward II. have been crowned. That chair might, perhaps, claim to be the throne of the Empire, as it is infinitely the most ancient, and inasmuch as the King must sit upon it to be crowned.

It is not at all likely that the King would sit upon it often, even if it were in his "ain-igloo-hook," because it is an extremely uncomfortable chair. It stands year in and year out, in the chapel of Edward the Confessor, where it was first placed by Edward I. and it is only removed for the Coronation, when, covered with gold brocade, it is set under the lantern, between the choir and the altar. Probably the throne most familiar to the public is the great creation which stands upon a dais in the House of Lords. It is often mentioned in the newspapers quite apart from the opening of Parliament—the only occasion upon which it is actually used as a seat. Often a phrase like this occurs: "Mr. John Burns, who is greatly interested in this bill, listened in the debate from the steps of the throne."
