Moreover, the ultimate consum mincemeat, if prices in the dearer sugar districts remain firm, may have to be satisfied with a less sugary variety than his sweet-toothed fc! lows in other parts of Canada, be cause there is apparantly much white sugar at the local retail "railads" to make up his festive dinna

\ccording to figures gathered by Canadian Press correspondents during Christmas shopping week, in many cities, the cheapest white sugar in the country is obtainable at Vancouver at 121/2 cents per pound with the brown half a cent lower Winnipeg and Regina asks 151/2 cents for the white and from one to one and a half cents less for the colored brother. These are the highest spots in the Canadian sugar market.

"The coldest weather of the winte December 25, with Christmas Day cloudy." said De Voe recently.


