DOMINION DAY.—Monday July 2nd will long be remembered by the people of this village and surrounding vicinity. It was the 10th anniversary of the confederation of the provinces of Canada; it was Port Albert's first, and we must say, successful attempt at honoring the occasion in a becoming manner. When the question of having a celebration in our village was first mooted, it found but few supporters; to these for the success of last Monday's demonstration is almost wholly and entirely due. Many there were, who lost not an opportunity of sneering at and making light of the honest endeavors of those who, without expecting the slightest recompense, were laboring so assiduously towards making the day what it proved to be in every sense of the term, a decided success. We have no hesitation now, however, in saying that on any future occasion of the kind, little difficulty will be experienced in securing the hearty and cordial support even of the few remaining doubting Thomases, and miserly creatures, who yet disgrace the precincts of our village. Although there were many attractions in other local places, yet at an early hour in the morning vast crowds in holiday attire came pouring in from the surrounding country, all seemingly intent on enjoying themselves to the best of their ability. The first act on the programme being the callithump procession, it is safe to say that it exceeded even the most longed anticipations of those who were its promoters. The most grotesque, the most outlandish costumes ever gotten up for an occasion of this kind were to be seen; the general opinion was "it is the best procession we have yet seen." Where all acquitted themselves so creditably, it may not seem fair in naming any particular individuals, still we feel justified in saying that R. DeLong as Sitting Bull; T. A. Hawkins, Amazon queen, and W. Graham and H. Pellow, Goderich butchers are particularly worthy of mention. The latter named gentlemen received the prize, as committed to mention the presence of the Ben-miller brass band, who, on their way to Kintail kindly furnished the music for the procession on their route. It is to be regretted that the procession took place at so early an hour, 9 a.m., as many who arrived in time to witness the athletic games, were disappointed in not seeing it.
