AREN'T THEY JUST AS BAD?



Almost everyone hates a snob. I am sure even the persons who are toadied to by the snobs must secretly despise them.

But aren't the people who are always suspecting other folks of being snobs, always resenting real or fancied slights, always saying things which are better than other people. I'd like to know what reason he has, etc." almost as worthy in their uneasy self-assertion, their self-conscious bluster, as the snobs themselves.

And Perhaps He Is.

Perhaps So-and-So does think he's better educated or better bred or more of a gentleman than many of the people with whom he comes into contact. And perhaps he is. Perhaps he does not care to associate with people who do not interest him. Can you blame him? Not if his manner is courteous and he pays due respect to the rights and feelings of others.

In our town there lived a woman who was criticized in this way. She was a middle-aged woman with a small income. She came to our town after the death of her husband, a distinguished statesman, and lived on a quiet little street occupied mostly by middle class families who had lived in the town all their lives—eminently respectable, thoroughly kindly and friendly people.

Now this woman was a thorn in the side of many of these people because she did not mix with them. She had a small garden in which she spent much time; she read a great deal, she kept up her music, and now and then she entertained friends of her youth from other cities. When she met the people who lived about her, she was always gracious and courteous to

them. She did more than one neighborly act in time of trouble or illness. But she simply showed that she did not care to mingle with them in her daily life.

Then I Understood.

This woman died the other day and in the notice of her death, to which even the big city papers gave considerable space, was a reminder of her past glories. Something was said about the brilliant life she had led in her husband's prime, the names of some of her distinguished relatives were given, and I, who had so often heard her criticized and heard so little said about what she really was, realized for the first time what the background of her life had been and why it would have been difficult for her to find any real companionship with the people who blamed her for being "different" and "stuck up."

She was better bred and better educated than the rest of us. She was used to a more complex and finished society. Why should we blame her for being so any more than we blame ourselves for not being able to enjoy people just as far below us in the scale of education and experience?

Did You?

I never yet knew a person who talked about people being snobs who did not look down on the people he considered below him, just as much as he blamed people above him for looking down on him.

True pride, it seems to me, does not consist in claiming that all people (except those who are, not as good as you) are equal, and that anyone who does not seem to enjoy you is stuck up—but in having fine standards of true worth, in being quick to recognize, look up to, and if possible make your own, whatever is worthy of admiration and imitation in others.

Volcano as Lighthouse.

A volcano on the island of San Salvador serves the purpose of a lighthouse.

This volcanic lighthouse is about eight miles inland from the port of Acapulco. It is a veritable pillar of cloud by day, and the flash of its light by night has been valuable to mariners for years.

It can be seen far out at sea, and a burst of flame has gone up every seven minutes without the variation of a second for many years. A lighthouse fee is collected from all vessels that put in at the harbor nearest the volcano, and no skipper objects. He knows that the volcano is more reliable than the lighthouses kept by human beings on other coasts, and the novelty of the light is worth the price charged by the Government.
