From Seamstress to Royal Rank.

When Mary Clement was bending her pretty head over her needle in Tailor Rennie's shop in Pall Mall, in the reign of George the First, she little dreamt that she would one day have a Countess for daughter and a Prince of the Blood Royal for son-in-law, and that her descendants would wear coronets as Duke and Earls. She was very beautiful as all the gallants knew who strolled along Pall Mall, but she had eyes for none save Edward Walpole, son of the great Sir Robert Walpole, England's Prime Minister, who occupied apartments above Master Rennie's shop. Thus it happened that Mary Clement stepped out of privation and poverty into the haven of a great peace and happiness. For a few brief years she was ideally happy with her handsome and high-born lover. She saw him a Member of Parliament, the first step on the road to the dignities of Knight of the Bath, Privy Councillor, and Chief Secretary for Ireland that were later his. She bore him five children, of whom her two boys died in infancy; then she slumped peacefully out of life. To Edward Walpole the honours that came in later years brought no solace for the loss of the woman whom he had loved so dearly, but he saw her three daughters grow up to a loveliness as great as hers. As the "lovely Miss Walpoles" they created as great a sensation as even the beautiful Miss Gunings. They all made good matches, but it was reserved for Mary, the loveliest of the sisters, to make the most splendid alliance, and to mingle in her children the blood of Mary Clement, the seamstress; with the blood of English Kings. First she became the wife of Earl Waldegrave, but was soon left a widow. Before long, however, she had at her feet the Duke of Gloucester, George III's favourite brother. She succumbed to his passionate pleadings, and became his wife. It was long before the King would consent to recognise the marriage, but when at last he yielded, he admitted the low-born Duchess to the full rank and privileges of a Princess of the Blood. But her day of splendour was not fated to last long. Her fickle husband lost his heart to Lady Almeria Carpenter, one of the most beautiful women of her time. In vain the Duchess tried all her arts to win back the truant, but when she realised that he was finally lost to her, she refused to share his home any longer, and devoted the remainder of her life to works of charity, which won for her the love of thousands, passing peacefully away on August 19, 1807. To her Royal Duke she bore two children—a son, Prince William Frederick, Duke of Gloucester, who married a daughter of George III, and the Princess Sophia, who died unmarried in 1844. Thus, had Mary Clement, Master Rennie's apprentice, but lived to middle age, she might have nursed as her grandchild an infant Prince who had a King for uncle, and who might conceivably have himself succeeded to the Crown of England.
