

CUTTING UP WHALES BY STEAM.—The whaling bark *Jess*, of New Bedford, is provided with an apparatus for hoisting power engine, to be used in cutting up whales and discharging cargo, hoisting top sails, if required, etc. This must prove a great saving of time and labor, as it usually requires 15 or 16 men to cut up a whale, while, with the help of the engine, six men can easily attend to it. The engine is stationed in the fore-cabin, occupying a space of ten feet by four feet. It will be the first ever carried to sea in a whaler for these purposes.

THE ANCIENTS.—Julius Caesar fought five hundred pitched battles, and killed one million and a-half of men. Manlius, who threw down the Gauls from the Capitol, had received twenty-three wounds and taken two captives before he was seventeen years of age. Donatus fought one hundred and twenty battles, was eighty time victorious in single combat, and received forty-five wounds in front. He had among his trophies seventy belts; eight mural, three oblongal, and fourteen civic crowns. Cato pleaded four hundred causes and gained them all. Cyrus knew the names of all the soldiers in his army; Lucius Scipio, it is said, of the Roman people. Chaimides could relate all that he had ever heard in the same words. Mithridates spoke to the ambassadors of twenty-two different nations without an interpreter.

INCREASE OF SUICIDES IN ENGLAND.—Suicides have increased of late in England. In the six years 1858-64, the annual average was a little over 60 to every 1,000,000 of population; but in the six years 1865-70, the latest period to which detailed returns extend, the annual average was nearer 68 than 67 in 1,000,000 of the population: in the first six years the number of a year only once reached 70 per 1,000,000 of population; in the last three years, 1868, '69, '70, the rates were 70, 73 and 70 per 1,000,000. The range in the twelve years from 62 per 1,000,000 in 1870 to 75 in 1870. Comparing the last period of six years with the first, we find that the suicides by drowning bear a larger proportion to the whole number of suicides than they did; but there is a smaller proportion of suicides by hanging than formerly, though that is the most frequent mode of self-destruction.

THE Essex Recorder says: There are nine locomotives and construction trains now employed on the line of the Canada Southern Railway, and within a month the road will permit of the running of through trains from one end to the other. It will be open for travel probably by the middle of January.
