

LEPROSY SUSPECT IS FOUND

Chinaman Being Held Pending Closer Scrutiny by Dominion Health Officials

Supposed Skin Disease Now Believed to be Evidence of Ancient Malady

Vancouver, Aug. 26.—What is considered to be a case of leprosy was discovered on Thursday. The patient is a Chinaman named Leon Gwan, who is now in strict isolation pending action by the Dominion medical authorities. Gwan was admitted to the hospital suffering from what was supposed to be a skin disease, but upon closer examination being made by the physicians were led to believe that the malady was a form of leprosy.

The medical health department was at once notified and a further examination was conducted, which confirmed the opinion already advanced. Communication was at once opened between the city health department and the Dominion station at William Head and the medical health officer is now awaiting instructions from the medical officer at that depot, who will decide at once on the policy as to the action that should be taken.

Inquiries were instituted and the hospital authorities made no effort to disguise the situation. It is understood that the malady from which the Chinaman is suffering is not of a virulent type and that there is no danger from further infection. The man had not been in even the most remote contact with any other patients and the medical officers that have been employed in isolating him are such that no greater peril is offered to other patients than if he were in some distant city of China.

No sooner had the symptoms manifested themselves than the Dominion authorities at William Head were notified, and all danger of possible infection have been absolutely eliminated. Contrary to the prevailing opinion, leprosy is not a very infectious disease. It is communicated solely by contact and even then only under peculiar conditions. Its rapid spread in Oriental countries is caused by the crowding together of people in one abode. The fact that nurses and Sisters of Mercy have dwelt for years in close communion with sufferers without being infected is the strongest proof that, where sanitary measures are invoked it does not readily obtain a hold.

JEWISH ORDER WILL AID IMMIGRANTS

"The immigrants the West will get on account of the Panama Canal will be the most adventurous, and therefore the best," said Dr. Nieto.
