

Who was Antonio Maceo?

Jose Antonio Maceo was a Cuban patriot. He was born in Santiago de Cuba in 1848. He joined the insurgent army as a private in 1868, and his natural ability and personal magnetism as a leader soon brought him to the front, making him second only to the great Gomez. Under his skillful leadership the Spanish were defeated at Demajugua and La Galetta; his campaign in Baracoa in 1878 showed masterly generalship, as did his utter rout of Santacledes at San Unio. Maceo alone of all the Cuban Generals refused to sign the peace of Zanjon. His achievements in the campaign of 1895 in the Pinar del Reo Province, and his battles at Paralijo and Jobita are among the most brilliant feats in the history of Cuba's struggle for independence. crossing the trocha between Majana and Mariel, in December 1896, attended only by his staff, he was surrounded by a Spanish force and killed.
