THE CHIEF OF SOVEREIGNS!

Lord Rosebery's Graceful Tribute to the Memory of Queen Victoria.

Duke of York's Illness Said To Be Accompanied by Pneumonic Symptoms—Preparations for a Gorgeous Funeral Pageant.

New York, Jan. 31.—Rumors were current late last night in London, says a Herald dispatch, that the Duke of Cornwall's measles are accompanied by pneumonic symptoms. The duchess has arranged to return to her husband's bedside as soon as she can hurry back from the funeral. All official reports unite in minimizing the attack.

According to a London dispatch to the World, the London Daily Express announces on what it claims to be the "highest authority," that it has been decided that the Duke of Cornwall and York is not to be created Prince of Wales, and, in fact, that the latter title is to be allowed to remain in abeyance for some years.

The Spanish battleship Pelayo, Spain's representative at the funeral, is commanded by Capt. Diaz Morau, who was commander of the Christopher Columbus which was lost in the battle of Santiago.

AT WINDSOR.

Practically the whole of the royal borough will be draped in mourning, whereas elsewhere only the route of the procession will be thus marked.

The service in St. George's Chapel will begin at 2 o'clock. The body is expected to arrive at Windsor at 1:30 p.m. The route to the chapel, which occupies half an hour, will be lined by troops two deep, the Eton volunteers participating with the guards. The services will be the ordinary services used for the burial of the dead with special music. The choir will sing from the altar steps whence also the Garter King of Arms will announce the decease of the sovereign and all her rights and titles.

Accommodation has been reserved on the left of the coffin for the princesses. The King and other crowned heads will stand at his head.

SATURDAY'S SERVICE.

The service on Saturday will be conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Bishop of Winchester and the Dean of Windsor. The Archbishop of York and the Bishop of Oxford will be present. The Interment on Monday will be conducted by the Bishop of Winchester and the Dean of Windsor.

Masses of flowers made up in crosses and crowns, from the blossoms that are the gifts of royal personages down to humble gifts sent in by children, several thousands of flower pieces, including tokens from most of the members of the aristocracy, county towns, cities, societies, regiments, inmates of workhouses, and even the smallest nosegays are laid out for public view side by side with the designs of great florists.

FRIENDLY ANGLO-GERMAN RELATIONS.

King Edward's speech to Crown Prince Frederick William of Germany, when investing him with the insignia of the Order of the Garter, is approved on all sides as furnishing additional proof of the friendly relations between the new monarch and Emperor William.

COMPLETE CLOSING OF BUSINESS.

Yesterday morning King Edward presided at a meeting of the Privy Council. The King signed a proclamation suspending business Saturday throughout the United Kingdom.

The closing down will be so complete that even the restaurants and saloons will be shut up for four or five hours in the middle of the day. Some of the afternoon newspapers will not be published Saturday.

Londoners are just awakening to the full proportion of the sorrow and the result of the days of mourning which to numerous tradesmen and others means absolute closure, is causing consternation. London is a world in itself, living from hand to mouth, and the closing of the accustomed avenues for the supply and distribution of food, drink, amusement, from Friday to Monday means a loss that no city would appreciate.

A member of the United States Embassy sent an agent to secure a window for his family, but neither official influence nor anything else could procure a small window even on a side street near St. James street for less than £100, and places of fair vantage have already been secured at prices prohibitive to any but millionaires.

SATURDAY PROCLAIMED A HOLIDAY.

Toronto, Jan. 30.—The government of Ontario last night issued a proclamation appointing Saturday "a public holiday to be observed as a day of general mourning."

Throughout our Province of Ontario, this settles all doubt as to the legal position on Saturday. Premier Ross says that all banks, legal offices and other places of business should close on Dominion Day and similar holidays must close on Saturday. So far as Ontario is concerned, therefore, the Dominion proclamation is supplemented by this further ruling.
