MORE TAXES FOR N. B. AUTO OWNERS

Road Patrol Funds to Come from This Source -Gas Tax Proposed

One of the new items of expendi ture in New Brunswick's Ordinary Revenue Account for the fiscal year

ended October 31st last, as just pub-lisned, is that of Roads Patrol. The new system inaugurated dur-ing the 1923 season and for which an extra impost was added to all automobile license feess cost \$161,-017,08 or almost as much as expend-ed on Ordinary Roads—\$152,122.97. Receipts under Motor Vehicle Fees amounted to \$374,278,58, including the extra impost to cover the Roads Patrol, and this year it is proposed to add a tax on gasoline to the con-tributions of automobile owners in ober 31st last, as just pub
