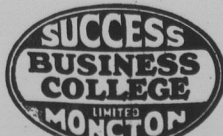

BRIDGE CONTRACT AWARDED
Hon. D. A. Stewart, Minister of Public Works has awarded the contract for building the Marquette Bridge Parish of St. Quentin, Restigouche County, to Armstrong Bros., Perth. The price is about \$14,000 and the bridge is to be erected according to Design B of the alternate designs submitted. Armstrong Bros. have just completed two highway contracts and have had considerable experience in public works.

The Bathurst hockey team has begun practice under the direction of John Barberie. It is their intention to devote three nights a week to training and local fans are looking forward to a busy season in this line of sport with a stronger line-up than last year.

**CHIEF INSPECTOR
IS APPOINTED**

W. L. McFarlane Is Named By
Local Government For
Position.

W. L. MacFarlane, of Nashwaakiss, who has been appointed Chief Inspector under the Prohibition Act, is due to take over the duties of Chief Inspector from John B. Hawthorne on December 1st, it was learned today, although Mr. McFarlane and Mr. Hawthorne both said this morning they had received no official notification as yet. Chief Hawthorne, who succeeded Rev. W. D. Wilson as Chief Inspector, tendered his resignation soon after the general provincial elections in August, but was asked to continue in office. Mr. McFarlane was an Inspector for York County under the Scott Act some twelve years ago and continued in office for several years. He had previously been Warden of York County and was for some years prominent in Municipal politics. He is head of the McFarlane Wagon Works at Nashwaakiss and has been actively identified with temperance work for many years.
