

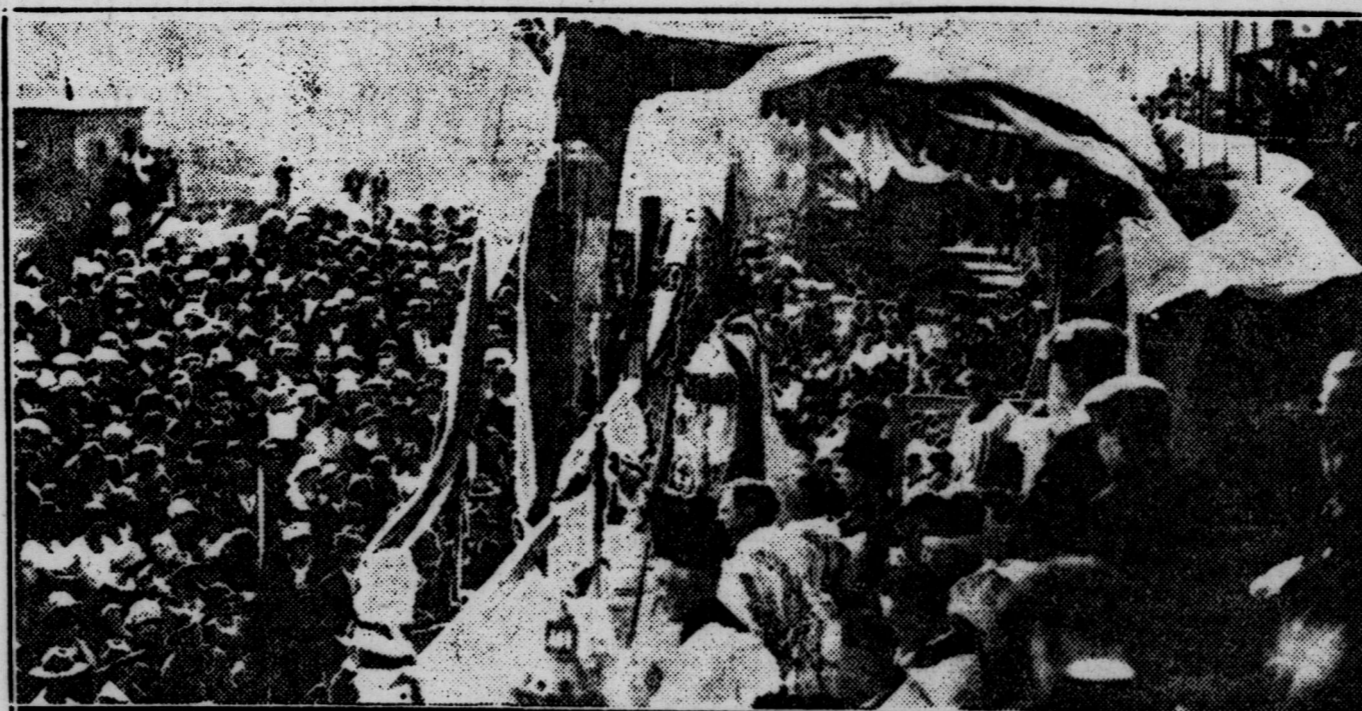
# IMPRESSIVE CEREMONY IN UNVEILING OF MEMORIAL TO WAR DEAD OF MANOR PARK

This was the first memorial of the Great War to be erected in London or immediate district, and there are nearly 2,000 people in attendance therefrom from Highland and Manor Parks and from all over the city.

The ceremony, impressive in the extreme, marked one of the greatest achievements in the work of the Roman Catholic church of the London diocese, and, in the words of Bishop Fallon, marked Sunday, May 31, as being one of the greatest days in the history of the diocese.
