We affirm that baptism was, from the time of its first institution, ful the remission of sins !-- "John did baptise in the wilderness, and pread the baptism of repentance for the remission of sins-Mark i. 4. " And he came into all the country about Jordan, preaching the baptism of n pentance for the remission of sins-Luke iii. 3. "Repent and be bad tized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ, for the remising "And now why tarriest thou? arise and by of sins,"-Acts in 38. baptised and wash away your sins, calling upon the name of the Lor -Act xxii. 16. "Baptism doth even now save us"-1 Peter iii. 21 "He that believeth and is baptised shall be saved"-Mark xvi. 16. these testimonies do not prove that baptism is "for the remission" sins," then there is no proposition under Heaven that can be provided by any testimony whatever-for the testimony in the present case positive, which is all that can be presented to prove any proposition Reader, do not the prejudices of your education, or does not the prig of party cause you to reject this doctrine of the gospel of the graced God?

If then in baptism we receive the remission, we experience in batism a change of state—we pass out of the unpardoned into the predoned state! "Know ye not that so many of us as were baptised in Jesus Christ, were baptised into his death?"—Rom. vi. 3. "For are all the children of God by faith in Christ Jesus. For as many you as have been baptised unto Jesus Christ, have put on Christ, Gal. in. 26, 27. These persons are here represented as having pseed out of the unregenerated into the regenerated state. How was the change effected? By faith. How is it proved to have been effected by faith? Why, "For so many of you as have been baptised," to It is as if he had said "Ye belie.ed and were baptised into him, the fore ye are children of God by faith in Christ Jesus;" ye were "be of water and the spirit," and are therefore children. If any will believe from the force of these positive declarations of holy writ, neith would they be persuaded though one should rise from the dead!

Pardon destroys the guilt of sin. We are the me anxious to introduce this topic lest some hypochondriac should supp that we believe that mere water washes away sins!! No, not war -" the blood of Jesus cleanseth from all sin." The blood of Ja "sprinkles us from an evil conscience." "We have r demption three his blood, the forgiveness of sins." Without the blood of Jesus the could be no remission. But we believe that the blood of Jesus efficacy to cleanse us, when in the water, from all sin! You believe that this blood cleansed you, not when in the water of baptism, when in the atmospheric air! And pray, why not be cleansed by atoning blood when in the water as well as when in the air? not rather be cleansed by this blood in baptism, as "baptism dother now save us?" Why not have your "hearts sprinkled from and conscience and your bodies washed with pure water?" Every ph under heaven is suitable with some people for remission but the which God has explicitly appointed!! Any place but the WATER to receive remission in baptism is heresy!!
