COMMERCIAL. GRAIN.

Feed—Several cars of Ontario bran have sold at \$14 per ton on track, and we quote \$14 to \$14.50 as to quality and quantity; shorts \$16 to \$17, middlings \$19 to 20, and moultie \$20 to \$25.

Wheat.—The market continues very quiet and prices for round lots are very irregular, owing to there being no settled basis of prices among millers.

Barley.—Choice malting grades are quoted at higher figures. Several cargoes have been shipped to England from this port lately.

Country Produce.—The market remains fairly steady with sales reported today at 10c per doz. for common. Choice fresh, graded stock is scarce and in demand for both home and English markets.

Dairy Produce.—Butter.—Sales have been made of September and a few early lots having fetched 20c per lb. in round lots.

Fruits, &c.—Quite a number of car lots of winter apples have been received during the week, and sales have been made at \$1.75 to \$2.00 per bushel.

Provisions.—The market is quiet and prices are very nominal. The market is steady and a few sales have been made in round lots to suit purchasers at from 7c to 10c per lb.
