THIS Institution having been duly opened on Monday, the 21st of January last, as formerly

Monday, the 21st of January last, as formerly norified, continues under effective operation,—The Rev. John Pryor, A. M. having charge of the departments of Classical Languages and Natural Philosophy; while those of the Mathematics, Moral Philosophy, Rhe-oric and Logic, are under the care of the Rev. E. A. Crawley, A. M. Hoth Professors also discharge the duties of private tutors to the students who are respectively distributed to them for that purpose; and, in this capacity, pay especial attention to all their studies, preparatory to the more public lectures and recitations, or otherwise.

Twenty-one Students above the usual College age of 14 years, and most of them considerably beyond that age, are at the present date in stated attendance on the studies of the several classe, and which are as far advanced as usual in the Collegiste course for the first year.

The public will understand that although the application to the Legislature for the same privileges as are enjoyed by other Colleges in this Province, possessing a similar number of students, and only a similar board of Instruction, has not as yet been successful; the Committee, nevertheless, confidently anticipate the success of so just an application at another Session of the Legislature,—and in the mean while the courses of Collegiate Instruction will go on with unabated progress; all College exercises and examinations will be strictly performed; and at the end of the usual College course, certificates of fitness for the respective degrees will be conferred on all students entitled to receive them, secompanied with the usual solemnities.
