OF THE CAMADIAN AND INDIAN DELEGATIONS THAT CAMADA AND INDIA HAD AGREED TO DEVOTE THE EQUIVALENT OF ABOUT DOLLARS 10 MILLION IN 40 COUNTERPART FUNDS TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF HIGHER TECHNOLOGICAL AND POLYTECHNIC SCHOOLS IN INDIA REFLECTS THE KEEN INTEREST TAKEN BY CAMADA IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF TEACHER TRAINING FACILITIES AND THE PROVISION OF ADEQUATE TECHNICAL EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS IN COMMON-WEALTH COUNTRIES. BOTH THESE INDICATIONS THAT CAMADA IS PREPARED TO PROVIDE INCREASED ASSISTANCE FOR THESE PURPOSES WERE EXTREMELY WELL RECEIVED AT THE CONFERENCE.

THE EXTENSION OF THE ARRANGEMENTS FOR TRAINING TEACHERS IN CANADA AND ABROAD WILL, OF COURSE, BE UNDERTAKEN AS PART OF CANADA'S EXISTING TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMME TO WHICH THE PROVINCIAL DEPARTMENTS OF EDUCATION HAVE MADE A MOST VALUABLE CONTRIBUTION.

THE IDEA OF A COMMONWEALTH EDUCATION CONFERENCE ORIGINATED AT THE COMMONWEALTH TRADE AND ECONOMIC CONFERENCE HELD AT MONTREAL IN 1958 WHEN CANADA PROPOSED THAT IN ADDITION TO THE EXCHANGES OF TEACHERS AND STUDENTS BETWEEN COMMONWEALTH COUNTRIES WHICH TOOK PLACE UNDER THE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMME OF THE COLOMBO PLAN. THERE SHOULD BE EXCHANGES AT A HIGH EDUCATIONAL LEVEL TO ENCOMPASS THE NATURAL AND SOCIAL SCIENCES, LAW AND OTHER ACADEMIC DISCIPLINES MOT NORMALLAY COVERED BY TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE. IT WAS AGREED AT HONTREAL THAT A CONFERENCE SHOULD BE HELD THIS YEAR IN THE UNITED KINGDON TO FORMULATE THE SCOPE AND DETAILED ARRANGEMENTS FOR A RECIPROCAL SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME AND TO REVIEW THE EXISTING BERANGEMENTS FOR COMMONWEALTH CO-OPERATION IN ALL FIELDS OF TOUCATION, PARTICULARLY WITH RESPECT TO THE SUPPLY AND TRAINING OF TEACHERS AND FACILITIES FOR TECHNICAL AND SCIENTIFIC EDUCATION WHICH WERE KNOWN TO BE OF PARTICULAR CONCERN TO THE UNDER-DEVELOPED COUNTRIES AND TERRITORIES OF THE COMMONWEALTH,

THE CANADIAN SELECATION AT OXFORD WAS READED BY THE HON.
JEORGE DREW, CARACIAN HIGH COMMISSIONER IN LONDON AND INCLUDED
