IMMIGRATION

DEPORTATION ORDER AGAINST MR. AND MRS. HENRI ZORIN

Hon. W. E. Harris (Minister of Citizenship and Immigration): I wonder whether I might have the consent of the house, Mr. Speaker, to revert to orders of the day to answer a question asked this afternoon by the hon. member for Dufferin-Simcoe (Mr. Rowe)?

Mr. Speaker: Has the minister the consent of the house to revert to that period?

Some hon. Members: Agreed.

Mr. Harris: He inquired about a gentleman by the name of Henri Zorin, who was under order of deportation in Montreal. I find I dealt with the appeal on December 15, and dismissed it. In the meantime, however, this gentleman has taken proceedings in the courts of Quebec in order to delay the operation of the deportation order. I feel, therefore, I should not make any statement about it.

BUSINESS OF THE HOUSE

Mr. Harris moved the adjournment of the house.
