*Mr. McBain*—On Wednesday next—The following proposed Resolution:— That, in the opinion of this House, the government should consider the advisability of introducing legislation, at the earliest possible date, to ensure that when domestic animals are slaughtered humane methods are used.

*Mr. Zaplitny*—On Wednesday next—The following proposed Resolution:— That, in the opinion of this House, the government should take into consideration the advisability of introducing an agricultural rehabilitation Act which would extend the scope and purposes of the present Prairie Farm Rehabilitation Act so as to include all agricultural areas in Canada, and which would make provision for flood control and land reclamation, and the rehabilitation of farmers now on sub-marginal lands.

*Mr. Smith* (Battle River-Camrose)—On Wednesday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, the government should take into consideration the advisability of taking steps to help relieve the financial crisis now found in the agricultural industry by extending the scope of and increasing the benefits of the present Agricultural Prices Support Act.

*Mr. McLeod*—On Wednesday next—The following proposed Resolution:— That, in the opinion of this House, the government should give early consideration to the advisability of establishing, generally with the provinces, a system of allowances to widows, based on need, and with provision for dependent children.

*Mr. Fisher*—On Wednesday next—The following proposed Resolution:— That, in the opinion of this House, the government should take into consideration the advisability of taking steps to relieve the financial crisis in education, without in any way encroaching on the exclusive jurisdiction of the provinces in this field, by granting financial assistance to the various provinces for the expansion and equalization of educational opportunity across Canada.

*Mr. Schulz*—On Wednesday next—The following proposed Resolution:— That, in the opinion of this House, the government should take into consideration the advisability of instituting a price support program for agricultural products sold on the home market on a parity level with other prices, and thus establish a fair relationship between farm prices and the prices farmers must pay for what they buy, which would eliminate the existing economic inequality between unprotected agriculture and protected industry, and raise the present low purchasing power of a group of people who are an important factor in our national economy.

Mr. Hahn—On Wednesday next—The following proposed Resolution:— That, in the opinion of this House, the government should consider the advisability of establishing a committee to study the effect of retail trade practices as between family operated trade stores and chain stores, and the subsequent effect of uncontrolled trade practices on the cost of living.
